

# NOT THE NATIONALS 2.0 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

[DP] Discretionary Penalty

# Organising Authority

The Royal Yacht Club of Tasmania.

#### 2. Rules

1.

The Regatta will be governed by the *rules* as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing 2021-2024.

There may be on-water rules observers, who may notify competitors on the water that a rule breach was observed. In this case competitors may consider taking a penalty at the time or initiating a protest. Protests arising from these observations may be initiated by the Protest Committee under RRS 60.3.

### 3. Entries

Eligible boats may be entered by completing registration with the organising authority in accordance with the Notice of Race.

The Regatta is open to monohull centreboard dinghies, sailboards and off-the-beach catamarans, holding a valid measurement certificate and/or class registration and as listed in the Notice of Race. All competitors must be bona fide members of a club affiliated with Australian Sailing.

# 4. Notices to Competitors

Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board at the OTB Centre of the Royal Yacht Club of Tasmania.

## 5. Changes in Sailing Instructions

Any change to the Sailing Instructions will be posted on the official notice board not less than 60 minutes prior to the first race on the day it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 1800 on the day before it will take effect.

## 6. Signals Made Ashore

Signals made ashore will be displayed at the flag pole at the OTB Centre of the Royal Yacht Club of Tasmania.

Flag AP with two sound signals (one when lowered) means "The race is postponed. The warning signal will be made not less than 30 minutes after AP is lowered." This changes *Race Signals*.

## 7. Schedule of Races

Races are scheduled as follows: There are eight races scheduled over two days with the warning signal for the first race on Saturday 8 January and Sunday 9 January at 13:00 hours.

Subsequent races will be back to back.

[NP] The Warning Signal for back to back races will be made not less than five (5) minutes after the last boat has finished the previous race. Competitors are expected to remain afloat and in the vicinity of the starting line.

After a long postponement, to alert boats that a race or sequence of races will begin soon, an orange flag will be displayed with one sound. The orange flag will be displayed for at least five minutes before a warning signal is displayed.

On the last day of the regatta no warning signal will be made after 1630 hours.

## 8. Division Flags

Division flags will be:

Six	Six	Spare

## 9. Racing Area

Course area will be between Battery Point and Bellerive Bluff.

#### 10. Courses

Courses shall be as described in Attachment 1.

#### 11. Marks

Marks shall be as described in Attachment 1.

#### 12. The Start

Signal	Flag and sound	Minutes before starting signal
Warning	Division flag, 1 sound	3
Preparatory	P, U or Black, 1 sound	2
One-minute	Preparatory flag lowered, 1 long sound	1
Starting	Division flag removed, 1 sound	0

This changes RRS 26.

The Race Committee may choose to start two or more Divisions at the same time. This will be indicated by the display of the two or more Division flags at the Warning signal.

The starting line will be between a pole displaying an orange flag on the race committee boat and the Start mark at the outer end.

[DP] [NP] A boat whose warning signal has not been made shall keep clear of the starting area and of all boats whose warning signal has been made. A boat starting later than three minutes after her starting signal will be scored DNS.

## 13. Change of Course After the Start

A change of course after the start will be signalled before the leading boat has begun the leg, although the new mark may not then be in position. Any mark to be rounded after rounding the new mark may be relocated to maintain the original course configuration. When in a subsequent change of course a new mark is replaced, it will be replaced with an original mark. This changes Rule 33.

### 14. The Finish

The finishing line will be between a pole displaying a blue flag on a race committee boat and the Finish mark as described in Attachment 1.

Flag L when flown from a race committee boat at the Finish shall mean *Another Race will start as* soon as practical. This changes Race Signals.

#### 15. Time Limit

The time limit will be 60 minutes for all Classes. Boats failing to finish within 15 minutes of the first boat in its Class or within the time limit, whichever is later, will be scored Did Not Finish. This changes Rule 35.

## 16. Protests

Protests shall be delivered to the race office within 45 minutes after the time of the last boat's finish for the last race of the day or after the Race Committee signals no more racing today, whichever is the latest.

Protests will be heard in approximately the order of receipt as soon as possible.

Appendix T – Arbitration will apply to this regatta, amended so that an arbiter may form part of a subsequent protest committee.

# 17. Scoring

Three races will constitute a series. Where fewer than six races are completed there will be no discard. When six races have been completed a boat will discard its worst score. This changes Appendix A.2.

# 18. Sign On, Sign Off

[NP] All competitors launching from and returning to RYCT shall sign on at the OTB Centre before going afloat and sign off there within one hour of the finish of the last boat in their division after the race or set of back-to-back races or the Race Committee signals no more racing today.

Boats sailing directly to the start area from their club or not returning to RYCT and proceeding directly from the finish area to their respective clubs shall sign on and off by notifying the Race Committee boat.

[DP] [NP] All boats shall sign on prior to their start at the Committee Boat for their course area once it is on station for starting.

Failure to sign on ashore will result in that boat being penalised five (5) places for the first race of the session (but not worse than DNF). Failure to sign off ashore shall result in that boat being penalised five (5) places for the last race of the session (but not worse than DNF). Penalties will be applied without a hearing.

This changes Rule 63.1.

#### 19. Prizes

Prizes will be awarded in all classes with the number of prizes dependent on the number of entries in the class as per the schedule in the Notice of Race. A range of bonus prizes may also be awarded.

## 20. Responsibility

All those taking part in the 2022 Not The Nationals 2.0 races do so at their own risk and responsibility. RYCT is not responsible for the seaworthiness of a boat whose entry is accepted or the sufficiency or adequacy of its equipment. Attention is drawn to Fundamental Rule 3 which states

The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone.

## Attachment 1 Courses and Mark Descriptions

This diagram shows the courses, the order in which marks are to be passed, and the side on which each mark is to be left.

Mark 1A will be approximately 900 metres from Mark 3. Mark 1 will be approximately 600 metres from Mark 3.








#### **Course Marks**

Marks 1, 2 & 3 will be orange and white inflatables. Mark 1A will be a yellow inflatable with a black band. Marks 1, 1A, 2 & 3 will be left to port.

The Start mark will be a yellow inflatable with a blue band.

The Finish mark will be a black & white chequered inflatable.

Change of course Mark 1 will be a yellow inflatable with a white band and Mark 1A will be an orange conical inflatable.



#### Course L1

Optimist, Sabot: Start - 1 - 3 - 1 - 3 - Finish (2 Laps)

ILCA 6 & 7: Start - 1A - 3 - 1A - 3 - Finish (2 Laps)

ILCA 4, Sabre: Start -1-3-1 Finish (2 Laps)

Sharpie: Start - 1A - 2 - 3 - 1A - 2 - 3 - Finish

29er: Start - 1A - 3 - 1A - 3 - Finish (2 Laps)

Moth, Waszp: Start - 1A - 3 - 1A - 3 - 1A - 3 - Finish (3 Laps)

Course L2

Optimist, Sabot: Start -1-3-1-3- Finish (3 Laps)

ILCA 4, 6 & 7, Sabre: Start - 1 - 3 - 1 - 3 - 1 - 3 - Finish (3 Laps)

Sharpie, 29er, Moth, Waszp: Start - 1A - 3 - 1A - 3 - 1A - 3 - Finish (3 Laps)

A separate course will be advised on each race day for Green Fleet Optimists
