The 2022-23 Combined Clubs Race and Cruising Program has been published. Thanks to the Vice Commodores and Sailing Managers of RYCT, DSS and BYC for their efforts over the winter months in surveying last season's skippers for their views and developing a program that hopefully suits the majority.

As the days lengthen and weather hopefully warms up soon, we are on the countdown to Opening Day Maneuvers on 1 October.

Entries open for the first race of the sailing season with some great prices to be won!

Sail in the wake of Captain Bligh's other mutiny the little-known naval blockade of Hobart Town in 1809.

After being deposed as Governor of New South Wales in the infamous Rum Rebellion of 1808, Bligh arrived in Hobart onboard the 'Porpoise' hoping to find a sympathetic shoulder to cry on with Governor Collins and maybe just maybe raise an army to take on the rebels back in Sydney. How wrong Bligh was!!

The two men clashed, in an act of defiance Bligh positions the 'Porpoise' at Bligh Point in the Channel and attempts to stop all shipping entering the River Derwent. Ships entering the Derwent with valuable provisions for the fledgling colony are stopped and Masters made sign a declaration stating that the Colony is in a state of rebellious anarchy. In 1810 Bligh returns to Sydney with the new Governor Macquarie restoring law and order.

The Royal Yacht Club of Tasmania is extremely pleased to have Captain Bligh Brewstillery as a major sponsor for the venerable Channel Race taking place on Sunday 2 October 2022.

The RYCT had four OTB kids competing - Adelaide O'Donoghue, Indy Cooper, Nick Jones & Tom Fader alongside 12 other Australian Sailors from across the country.

With only three finals races sailed due to the cancellation of racing on the final day from no wind.

Both Adelaide & Tom had a good day of finals race results, jumping up the results sheet from their positions at the end of qualifying.

Credible results were achieved from our sailors considering it was their first 'big stage' regatta, having to contend with at least 70 boats on the start lines and negotiation of over 440 boats on and off the shore each day.

We are lead to believe that the regatta is the largest ever held for the ILCA4 class and definitely presented some challenges both onshore and on water.

The Australian Team were ably supported by coaches Luke Elliot (Swift), ILCA7 Australian Team member & Annie Eastgate ILCA6 Sailor.

Results @ completion of the regatta:

Girls division comprising of 154 boats sailing.

Adelaide O'Donoghue – 55th overall & 2nd Australian.

Indy Cooper – 116th overall & 5th Australian.

Boys division comprising of 272 boats sailing,

Tom Fader – 149th position overall & 3rd Australian, 47th under16 sailor overall out of 100 competitors & 1st under16 Australian.

Nick Jones – 239th position overall & 7th Australian.



MAST Powerboat Courses

In Tasmania, a motorboat licence is required to operate a vessel 4hp or more (except for a hire and drive vessel).

The RYCT is an accredited provider of the MAST Motor Boat Licence which is valid for a three year period (pro-rata) and all licences have a common expiry date.

RYCT Trivia


RYCT Trivia is on every Tuesday night and all are welcome!
