
Learn to Sail Tackers Courses


With the upcoming school holidays we are getting ready to provide some more learn to sail courses at our Discover Sailing Centre.

In Tasmania, a motorboat licence is required to operate a vessel 4hp or more (except for a hire and drive vessel).

The RYCT is an accredited provider of the MAST Motor Boat Licence which is valid for a three year period (pro-rata) and all licences have a common expiry date.

Every month we are asking one of our members some questions, so you get to know your fellow members a little bit better. Meet Karen Davis, an associate family member of 9 years of our Club.






