





Well done to all the competitors in negotiating the River Derwent at it's fickle best!!!



Learn to Sail Tackers Courses


With the upcoming school holidays we are getting ready to provide some more learn to sail courses at our Discover Sailing Centre.





His research and sleuthing included the ransacking of 'the bowels of Government House' only to conclude that a letter dated 15th May 1908 granted us permission to use the 'Royal' prefix, and thus our centenary celebrations were "nearly two years late!!"

The address received great laughter and applause. I believe the date 21st January 1910 is a letter on display opposite the Reception of the Club, granting permission to fly the Blue Ensign.
