Combined Clubs Long Race Series

Matthew Keal and his crew on Heatwave cleaned up all three Group 1 handicap divisions in Saturday 18th of March is final Long Race of the season.

Sailed in tricky, stop – start conditions, Heatwave was able to avoid the majority of the quiet patches and stay in touch with the larger, faster boats in Group 1. The first six boats to cross the line finished inside two minutes of each other after four and a half hours of racing.

Garry Smith's Fork in the Road took line honours narrowly from Chris Sheehan's Assagai and Gary Cripps' Guilty Pleasures VI.

But Heatwave's brilliance on the day was not enough to seal overall wins, with Ian Johnston's Zephyr Insurance Masters pipping her for first on countback in PHS. Heatwave finished second overall by a solitary point to the Calverts' Intrigue in IRC, and third, also one point behind Zephyr Insurance Masters, in ORC Club, a division also won by Intrigue.

In Group 2 ORC Club Footloose held on to edge Jiyuu on countback with Mako making a late run for third overall, knocking Justin Barr's Rumbeat off the podium. In IRC, Footloose once again prevailed from Mako and Ambrose Coad's The Dog House.

In Group 3 Ian Smith and Dean Aberle sailing Innovator came from third place overall going into Saturday's race to win overall honours on countback from Peter Bosworth's Astrolabe, leapfrogging Steve Mannering's Camlet Way who took third overall in this very tight Group.


Off The Beach Sailing

Winter races will start mid-May program coming out in early April.








Tackers Learn to Sail Courses

MAST Powerboat Courses

In Tasmania, a motorboat licence is required to operate a vessel 4hp or more (except for a

hire and drive vessel).

The RYCT is an accredited provider of the MAST Motor Boat Licence which is valid for a three-year period (pro-rata) and all licences have a common expiry date.

The cost is \$130 per person.

PROVISIONAL COURSES

The MAST Motor Boat Provisional licence for children 12-17 years can be offered during all courses.

The cost is \$100 for a provisional licence.


