NOTE: Items marked ** require a prescription. In addition to the above list, cruisers should consider items specific for their crew's individual needs, and items as follows that may be useful depending on first aid, paramedic or medical ability:

Penthrane, Oxycodone (10 mg and 20 mg), Ceftriaxone, Amoxycillin/Clavulanic acid, Metronidazole, Midazolam, Ondansetron, Lignocaine inj, Framycetin ear drops, Omeprazole, Iaxative (Dulcolax), Salbutamol, Prednisone, Mupirocin, antihistamine (Loratadine), steroid cream (e.g. Betnovate), saline ampoules, suture kit, skin stapler, oil of cloves, temporary dental filling material, sterile gloves, loupe, Israeli emergency bandage, paraffin gauze dressing, gladwrap strips roll.
